# Section 1

Good Afternoon!

We hope everyone had a great week!

As we wrap up the week ending August 14, our teams continue working through the heart of Southwest Florida's summer growing season. The combination of heat, humidity, and frequent afternoon storms continues to create challenging field conditions, but it is also keeping the landscape actively growing. And yes at this point, I think we can all agree that we are happy to see the rain!

Our crews remained focused throughout the week on maintaining the community's appearance while also making responsible decisions based on daily weather and soil conditions.

## This Week at a Glance

Our teams completed the regularly scheduled maintenance throughout the community, including:

Weekly mowing and turf maintenance

Line trimming and hard edging

Blowing and cleanup of roadways, sidewalks, and common areas

Continued shrub trimming and detail pruning

Landscape quality inspections

Agronomic inspections and turf monitoring

Found a leaking flush point ( Thanks to Rebecca and Kathy)

The combination of consistent mowing, trimming, edging, and detail work continues to keep the community looking its best during one of the most active growing periods of the year, the best we can of course!

Our team is also continuing to monitor Mount Tumalo, which remains scheduled for mowing within the next two weeks as part of the ongoing maintenance cycle.

## Summer Weather & Landscape Conditions

We continue to see very typical Southwest Florida summer conditions, with temperatures remaining in the low 90s, high humidity, and frequent afternoon thunderstorms.

One of the biggest challenges this time of year is how localized the rainfall can be. One portion of the community can receive significant rainfall while another receives very little. These fluctuations can create noticeable differences in turf growth, soil moisture, weed pressure, and disease activity from one area to another.

The increased moisture and heat also create ideal conditions for seasonal turf pests and fungal activity. Our Agronomic Team is actively monitoring for issues such as:

Chinch bugs

Armyworms

Sod webworms

Mole crickets

Turf disease and fungal activity

Increased weed pressure

Where conditions warrant, our teams will make recommendations and treatment adjustments accordingly.

#### A Quick Reminder About Rain & Mowing

With the amount of rain we are currently receiving, there may be occasions when certain areas of the community cannot be serviced on their normal schedule.

We understand that everyone wants to see the crews complete their work on time, but mowing or operating heavy equipment on saturated soils can create significantly more damage than temporarily delaying service.

Wet conditions can result in:

Tire tracks and rutting

Soil compaction

Turf tearing and root damage

Damage to already weakened turf

Equipment-related landscape damage

Our goal is not simply to mow every area every week—it is to maintain the landscape correctly and protect the long-term appearance of the community.

If an area has to be temporarily postponed due to conditions, our crews will return as soon as the property is suitable for safe and responsible service.

### Irrigation & Landscape Monitoring

Our Irrigation and Landscape teams will continue paying close attention to:

Irrigation coverage and system performance

Turf recovery and growth

Drainage and standing water

Plant health

Seasonal pest activity

Fungal disease

Overall landscape presentation and curb appeal

As we have mentioned throughout the summer, irrigation is designed to supplement rainfall, not replace Mother Nature. With rainfall patterns changing daily, our teams will continue making adjustments based on actual field conditions rather than taking a one-size-fits-all approach.
